Isaiah 64:1-9

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence!

When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect. you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. The Gospel according to Mark chapter 13. *Glory to you, O Lord.*

[Jesus said] "But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in clouds' with great power and glory. Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. "From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. 



Advent Worship Schedule

10 December is Human Rights Day, and this year's observance marks the 75th anniversary of the signing of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. On this day, our congregation will join a common worship service with the German-Speaking Congregation and the congregation of the Madeleine Church; students from the Ecumenical Institute at Bossey are also helping to plan and lead. The service will be bilingual (German and English) and will take place at 10h00 at the Temple de la Madeleine (just down the hill from the Lutheran Church).

Following the service, all are invited to join in an interfaith "Faith for Rights" walk. We begin at the Madeleine and continue first to the Dituria Mosque (Route de Saint-Julien 163, 1228 Plan-les-Ouates) and then to the Adventist campus (33 chemin du Pérouzet, F-74160 Collonges). Food and drinks will be offered along the way, and the day will conclude with a concert at the Adventist campus at 15h30.

Please note: our congregation will not hold a worship service at the Lutheran Church on this day.
