Post-worship forum: "No One Can Serve Christ and Caste": Indian Ecumenical Initiatives to Combat Caste – TODAY

Today, Rev. Dr. Peniel Rufus, a former member of our church and Global Theologian at United Society Partners in the Gospel (USPG), will present on Indian ecumenical initiatives to combat caste. Caste-based discrimination against the Dalit communities is a challenge that continues to affect Indian churches. Peniel will explore how the ecumenical movement (local and global), the various human rights movements and Indian theologians have sought to engage with the question of Dalit liberation. He will further share the various sites of the Indian church's engagement in combating caste, and by doing so, examine the patterns and perspectives of ecumenical cooperation in doing Christian mission from the margins.

This presentation is part of a series of post-worship forums to contribute to adult Christian education in our church this summer.

Year to Date financial update from the Treasurer: June 2024

Dear Congregation members,

Please find below a monthly financial update of our church. This update was presented at the recently concluded CC meeting of 30 June 2024.

Income

Our budgeted income for 2024 is **CHF 321,145.-** (excluding the 3K contribution from Music Ministry fund, which would make the budget CHF 324,145.-). *The pro-rata total income as of 31.05.2024 should have been about CHF 134,000- But the actual income stands at CHF 104,705.- (after deducting the dissolution of general reserve),* which is about **CHF 29,300.- behind** our target. Last month this difference was CHF 21,500.-. Despite the announcements in the Assembly and in the weekly bulletins, the gap between pro-rata income and the actual income continues to increase, which is a concern.

Therefore, I request you to continue giving throughout the summer this year, to bring our finances back on track. The CC is exploring some strategies for additional fund-raising activities in order to avoid last year's situation.

Expenditures:

The expenses as of 31.05.2024 is CHF 114,072.- which is about **CHF 6,000.- more** than the total income and about **9000 CHF** more than absolute income (without reimbursement to GR), primarily due to lower pro-rata income. On behalf of the CC, I wish to thank you for your generous support to our congregation's ministry and look forward to the same in the coming months.
