Writing on the Lord's Prayer Card:

"Save us"

At the altar, retrieve your card from previous weeks. If you were not here before in Lent, take a blank card. Invite one other person to write on your card, "Save us" in their own language. Maybe at the same time, you write on theirs. Pens with different colors are on the tables and on the altar for drawing. You might use the printed graphic as a model, but feel free to add your own artistry. We all become scribes. Other phrases of the prayer will be added during the services to come.

When the writing is complete, put your card back its envelope and put it in the box in alphabetical order so you can retrieve it when you next come to church. If you were not here before in Lent, take an envelope, put your name on it, and add it to the others. If you are a visitor, you might ask more than one person to write on the card. Then take the card with you as a reminder of the service and as an invitation to pray.

Holy Week Worship Services

Holy Week is the center of the church year, following the last days of Jesus's life, from his entry into Jerusalem to his betrayal, death, and resurrection. We will gather for worship several times during the week.

Maundy Thursday, 17 April: Worship at 19h30 – We remember Jesus's last night with his disciples by sharing Communion and washing one another's feet.

Good Friday, 18 April: Worship at 19h30 – We tell the story of Jesus's betrayal and death.

Easter Eve, 19 April: Worship at 20h30 – We share stories of God's deliverance, proclaim the good news of the resurrection, and conclude worship with a feast.

Easter Day, 20 April: Worship at 11h00 – We continue the celebration of Easter with a bright and festive service.

All worship services will take place at the church, and all except the service on 17 April will be livestreamed on our YouTube channel. All are welcome!

Harvest Festival – Sunday 18 May

This year's Harvest Festival is fast approaching! This is an important annual event, raising funds for churches and organizations beyond our congregation. Please note that it will take place in the sanctuary, following worship on Sunday 18 May.

This year we will hold a raffle (or "tombola") of the gifts offered by our community.
