

the restorer of streets to live in.



She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, 'Woman, you are set free from your ailment.' 
Been through the fire and the rain, bound in every kind of way. But God has broken every chain, so let me go right now.






