I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God




Usper Luke 10.9-14






## Offertory (stand) Your hand, O God, has guided







The service will take place at the Cathédrale St-Pierre at 11h00—all are welcome.

Please note: there will be no worship service at the Lutheran Church on this day.

#### **Peace Symbols**

The worship committee is exploring symbols and gestures for peace. We know many, e.g. the dove, the handshake we use during our worship services, paper cranes, candles floating in the water, olive branch. But we suspect that in our multicultural congregation many other possibilities might be explored. We are planning an Advent focused on prayers for peace. Our planning would be much improved with images, symbols or gestures that are used in different parts of the world. Since we will be praying for Asian countries, during Adent, ideas from that region would be particularly welcome, but we are open to other regions as well. Don't be shy. We cannot incorporate into worship what we don't know. If you have something to share, please send an email to the office and a member of the worship committee will contact you.

#### Choir Rehearsals - Preparing a new anthem with brass choir and organ

This week we are finalizing an anthem composed by Yanis Eberhardt, based on the melody we have been singing while we bring forward the offering. This will be performed with the German choir next Sunday, 2 November, as part of the ecumenical service in the Cathedral. We practice as normal on Thursday evening in the church from 19h30-21h00. Then on Saturday, 1 November, there will be a rehearsal in the Cathedral St. Pierre from 10h00-11h00 with the organ and the brass.
